Position requirements

INSOL ERA Committee members are in the early stages of their professional or academic career, who are interested in insolvency and restructuring law matters. This usually means that you will:

- Have been working in academia for less than 10 years after receiving your doctorate;
- Have been working in private practice on insolvency issues for less than 10 years; or
- Hold a position of a doctoral candidate, post-doctoral researcher, lecturer, senior lecturer or assistant professor.

In addition to meeting the above criteria, you should have:

- Strong research background and interest in insolvency law;
- Enthusiasm for collaborative work and a willingness to actively participate in INSOL ERA's activities;
- Excellent communication skills and a passion for advancing insolvency law research.

If you are eager to contribute your expertise, energy, and new ideas to the INSOL ERA Committee, we encourage you to apply.

Application process

If you are interested in becoming a member of the INSOL ERA Committee, please submit your CV along with a brief statement of interest (max. 500 words) highlighting your research background and why you would like to join the committee. Applications should be sent to ERA@insol.org by **31 July 2023**. You will be notified about the result of your application by 15 August 2023.

The decision about new members will be made by the current INSOL ERA Committee, subject to the approval of the INSOL Academic Steering Committee. Selection considerations may include academic background, past involvement in INSOL ERA activities, as well as geographical, gender and other characteristics to ensure diversity and inclusion.
